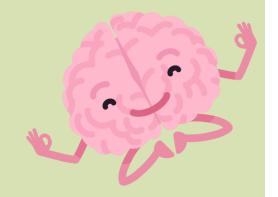

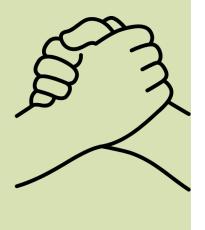

Breakfast Program

Bus Video Cameras

The Division believes the use of video cameras on school buses will enhance the safe operation of its school buses.
